RTO Entry Requirements:

- Applicants are to have a Unique Student Identifier (USI) This is obtainable from usi.gov.au If a USI is not supplied and verified with usi.gov.au a statement of attainment cannot be issued to the student.
- For courses undertaken in 12 months or less, students will be invoiced the full course fee (including any other essential fees associated with the course).
